# **History of Program**

Silver State Claybreakers was formed in 2002. We started with 5 athletes and quickly grew to 58. During those first few years we campaigned and encouraged youth trap shooting throughout the state. We helped form youth shooting groups in Winnemucca, Elko, Fallon, Yerington, Reno and Carson City and Ely. After forming our groups, we increased the youth participation at the Nevada State Shoot from 2 entries to 126 entries.

In 2006 we created "invitational" shoots which encouraged youth shooting groups in the surrounding states to have team challenges. Our first invitational was a huge success with teams from San Diego Shotgun Sports, Oaktree Jr. Claybreakers, Ogden, Stockton, Red Mountain, A & A Sports, Golden Spike, Project 2000 and Santa Ynez. Many of these clubs now use our model program to encourage youth competition.

We also took our teams to compete at the Grand American several years, and in 2008 our "Rookie" team (3rd thru 5th grade) won First Place at the Grand American.

In 2008 we applied and were approved as an IRS 501 c (3) Non Profit Corporation.

In 2011 our State Youth Shooting Board decided to form NYSSA, (Nevada Youth Shooting Sports Association). The NYSSA Board consists of a member of each shooting club in the State. This board of directors have created guidelines, in the form of a handbook. The handbook in addition to our by-laws set forth the rules of membership and competition. Each year we hold an NYSSA State Shoot. The location of the shoot rotates each year. Each of our 7 State groups (Fallon, Yerington, Reno, Las Vegas, Elko, Carson City and Ely) are free to develop their individual program based on circumstances in their area as long as they abide by the by-laws and handbook. For instance, Fallon's program runs from April through July. They shoot once a week in the evening.

# **Overview of current Program**

This program is designed to introduce athletes and their families to the sport of Clay Target shooting. **Emphasis is on GUN SAFETY, SPORTSMANSHIP, Discipline, Integrity, Responsibility and building self-confidence.** All coaches have been clay target shooters for many years. All of the coaches are certified NRA Certified Shotgun Instructors. All coaches "volunteer" their time and expertise. No one in the organization is paid a salary.

Our group is a member of NYSSA, Nevada Youth Shooting Sports Association. Our total source of funds comes from donations and fundraisers. Each athlete will be asked to participate in the fundraising projects. Loaner guns are available if you do not have one. The athletes never take these guns home.

Attendance at each scheduled practice is a must. If you cannot make a practice, please inform one of the coaches (list attached). We also encourage you to practice on your own between scheduled practice dates. We will try to arrange for a coach to be present. Advance notice is necessary if you wish a private lesson. There are 3 competition divisions when shooting under the NYSSA program.

#### Senior

High School Athletes in 9, 10, 11, 12 grades. There are 2 subdivisions in this group. Varsity and Junior Varsity. Varsity athletes are those who start their 2nd year in our program. Junior Varsity athletes are those who are in 9th grade or those in 10, 11 or 12 grade when it is their 1st year in the program.

#### Junior

Those in 6, 7, 8 grades. There are 2 subdivisions in this group. Intermediate entry and Intermediate advanced. Intermediate advanced athletes are those who start their 2nd year in our program. Intermediate entry athletes are those who are in 6th grade or those in 7 or 8 grade when it is their 1st year in the program.

#### Rookie

Those in 5<sup>th</sup> grade and below.

\*\*Note, if your athlete participates in a competition under the Amateur Trapshooting Association (ATA) his shooting category or division is determined by his age as of September 1st of the current shoot year. Those classifications can be found in the ATA rule book.

# **Costs**

A first year registration fee of \$100.00 is required which helps to cover the costs of liability insurance and a team shirt. After that, returning athletes pay a yearly fee of \$50.00

# Weekly Practice Costs:

Practice is normally held at Clark County Shooting Complex with practice rounds currently costing \$4.50 for 25 targets plus shells. Additionally, shotgun ammunition can be purchased from Clark County Shooting Complex. Prices are subject to change based on shooting facility.

# **Monthly Challenge Costs:**

We hold a monthly Challenge competition at various shooting ranges in the area and range fees are determined by that facility, but will usually be about the same as above weekly costs. Shells for the competition can be purchased from our club, currently \$60 per case of 10 boxes or \$6.00 per box.

Prices quoted are subject to change.

If you choose to purchase your ammunition elsewhere, please follow these guidelines. 12 Gauge shells should not exceed a 2-3/4 dram powder equivalent. Game loads are not appropriate for trap due to the recoil and heavy powder charge. Shot size should be 7.5, 8 or 8.5 and a 1 oz. or 1-1/8 oz. of shot is adequate.

#### Equipment

Before you purchase anything, check with our Coaching Staff. We have a list of vendors who will give discounts to members of our group. Each athlete needs the following equipment:

- 1. A 12, 20, 28, Shotgun
  - If you do not have a shotgun, a loaner will be provided for a short period of time until the athlete can purchase his own.
- 2. Shells appropriate for your gauge gun (note: 20 and 28 gauge shells are more expensive than 12 gauge ammunition)
- 3. Eye protection (mandatory & you provide)
- 4. Ear protection (mandatory & you provide)
- 5. Shell pouch (loaners are available until you are able to purchase your own.)
- 6. Shooting vest (optional- you provide)
- 7. Shirt (provided at registration)
- 8. Sun Screen (optional-you provide)
- 9. Water bottle (optional-you provide)

10. Shooters towel (optional-you provide)

It is also recommended that you obtain a small sports bags to keep all of your equipment together. **EAR AND EYE PROTECTION MUST BE WORN WHEN SHOOTING AND SCORING -- NO EXCEPTIONS** 

# **Competitions**

Athletes are not eligible to participate in competitions such as the NYSSA State Shoot, Scholastic Invitational's or Challenge shoots until they have completed a safety course and have shot a minimum of 6 practices shooting at least 50 targets at each practic0e during the 3 months prior to the date of the competition. This requirement may be waived with the recommendation of a Silver State Clay-Breakers coach.

The Nevada Youth State Shoot, (NYSSA), is held in June of each year. All athletes in good standing are encouraged to attend. Coaches organize teams by category, (Varsity, Jr. Varsity, Intermediate Entry, Intermediate Advanced and Rookie). Each team will consist of 5 shooters plus alternates and will compete as a team in the 200 bird Singles Championship. (Additionally, they will be competing as individuals by category named above). Trophies for 1st, 2nd, & 3rd, place teams and individuals will be awarded.

Selection of the teams will be based on many factors:

- Participation at practices
- Marksmanship
- Scholastic Average
- Sportsmanship
- Participation in fund raisers

We will also be organizing competitions between our athletes and other youth clubs in other states.

# Athlete Requirements (Do's & Don'ts)

- 1. No smoking at practices or at any shooting events.
- 2. No Drugs.
- 3. Eye and Ear Protection Required.
- 4. Knowledge and adherence of ATA & NYSSA rules (see Silver State Claybreakers website for NYSSA handbook and see the Amateur trapshooting website for the ATA rule book (shootata.com).
- 5. A grade point average of 2.0. Proof of GPA must be furnished by February 1st of each year.
- 6. All participants must attend the Gun Safety Course (provided by the coaches) and at all times practice Gun Safety.
- 7. Good sportsmanship is a must.
- 8. Participation in fundraisers is required.
- 9. Must attend all training courses and pass academic test.
- 10. All Claybreaker consent forms must be completed and sent to Linda Hand, 339 W. Sherwood Drive, Henderson, NV 89015
- 11. Athletes must be punctual !!!
- 12. Proper dress means;
  - shorts must reach finger-tips when hands are at sides.
  - no open toed shoes

- no improper sayings or pictures on shirts
- no midriff shirts or tank tops

Note: Parents are required to attend practices and volunteer as scorekeepers and participate in fundraisers.

# **Fundraisers**

Parents can help by contacting their employers who currently sponsor youth groups in other sports like baseball, basketball, etc. Any type of donation can be put to good use. Money always helps. If a company cannot give funds, perhaps they can donate something for our raffles. (A weekend stay at one of the hotels, dinner for two, etc.)

We will be holding raffles so start gathering those item. Perhaps your barber or salon will donate a cut and style, etc.

Remember the more money we raise, the less it costs you to shoot.

# **Awards & Competition Structure**

We use a point system through-out the year. Points are given for marksmanship, attendance, dress and grade point average.

# Awards given at Christmas Party at end of year consist of Patches and Rockers as follows:

Pro-Marksman Rocker	Score 19 or better out of 25	10 times
Marksman Rocker	Score 20 or better out of 25	10 times
Marksman 1st Class Rocker	Score 21 or better out of 25	10 times
Sharpshooter Rocker	Score 22 or better out of 25	10 times
Expert Rocker	Score 23 or better out of 25	15 times
Distinguished Expert	Score 24 or better out of 25	15 times

Recorded practice scores, Challenge Shoot Scores, ATA verified scores, CYSSA and NYSSA scores can be used to satisfy this requirement.

# Challenge Shoot Awards (Medals) given Quarterly. Points accumulate to end of shoot year.

Points are given by Category (Varsity, Jr. Varsity, Int. Entry, Int. Advanced, Rookie) to 1st through 5 place. Medals are awarded quarterly.

Other points can be earned at Challenge Shoots for attendance (5 points) and proper dress (5 points). Proper dress consists of having properly maintained equipment (clean gun, team shirt, ear and eye protection, etc.)

# Lettering at your School

Just like any other sport, you may be able to earn a "School Letter". Requirements are:

- Participate in at least 10 shoots during the shoot year. (Challenge Shoots, Nevada State Shoot, CYSSA Shoots, NYSSA Shoots)
- Skill average of Class "B" or higher (91 out of 100)
- Participate in Fundraiser
- Must attend the NYSSA State Shoot
- Must have a grade point average of 2.5 or higher
- Must write a 1 page essay on:
  - a. What I have learned from participating in shooting sports.
  - b. How can I use what I have learned.
- Pass a test on gun safety and history of shooting sports.

New athletes must take a Gun Safety Class provided by one of the coaches.
